

Summary of Executive Order on Promoting the Export of the America AI Technology Stack

On July 23, 2025, President Trump issued an Executive Order 14320, [Promoting the Export of the American AI Technology Stack](#), establishing the American AI Exports Program to accelerate global deployment of U.S. AI technologies and strengthen U.S. leadership. The program coordinates exports of full-stack AI packages—hardware, software, infrastructure, and services—while using federal financing and diplomatic efforts to counter adversaries. It builds on prior initiatives, including the Biden Administration’s [2024 Economic Diplomacy Action Group](#) (EDAG).

Purpose and Policy Direction: The order affirms U.S. policy to sustain AI leadership by accelerating exports and global adoption of U.S.-developed technologies, reducing reliance on adversarial systems, and advancing American standards and governance models.

Establishes an American AI Exports Program with a Call for Proposals: The Secretary of Commerce, in consultation with the Secretaries of State and Defense, as well as the Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP), is directed to create, implement the American AI Exports Program within 90 days. Under the Program the relevant agencies will solicit proposals from industry-led consortia to that:

- Include a full-stack AI export package;
- Identify target countries or regions for export;
- Outline business and operational plans;
- Detail requested federal incentives and support; and
- Comply with all relevant U.S. export control regimes, outbound investment regulations, and end-user policies.

Provides Framework for Proposal Evaluation Process: The Secretary of Commerce, in consultation with the Secretaries of State, Defense, and Energy, as well as the Director of OSTP, are responsible for evaluating proposals for including under the Program. The identified proposals will be designated as priority AI export packages, eligible for federal support.

Mobilizes Federal Financing Tools: The executive order seeks to coordinate financing, including by:

- activating the Economic Diplomacy Action Group (EDAG) to coordinate federal financing and strategic export promotion for priority AI packages, using tools such as technical assistance, direct loans, equity investments, credit guarantees, and feasibility studies through agencies including SBA, Ex-Im Bank, and DFC.
- directing the Secretary of State to develop a unified AI export strategy with EDAG, align technical, financial, and diplomatic resources, engage in multilateral and bilateral partnerships, support pro-innovation regulatory and infrastructure development in partner countries, analyze market access opportunities, and promote investment in small business innovators and U.S.-based AI manufacturing.
